*Lift High the Cross #881*

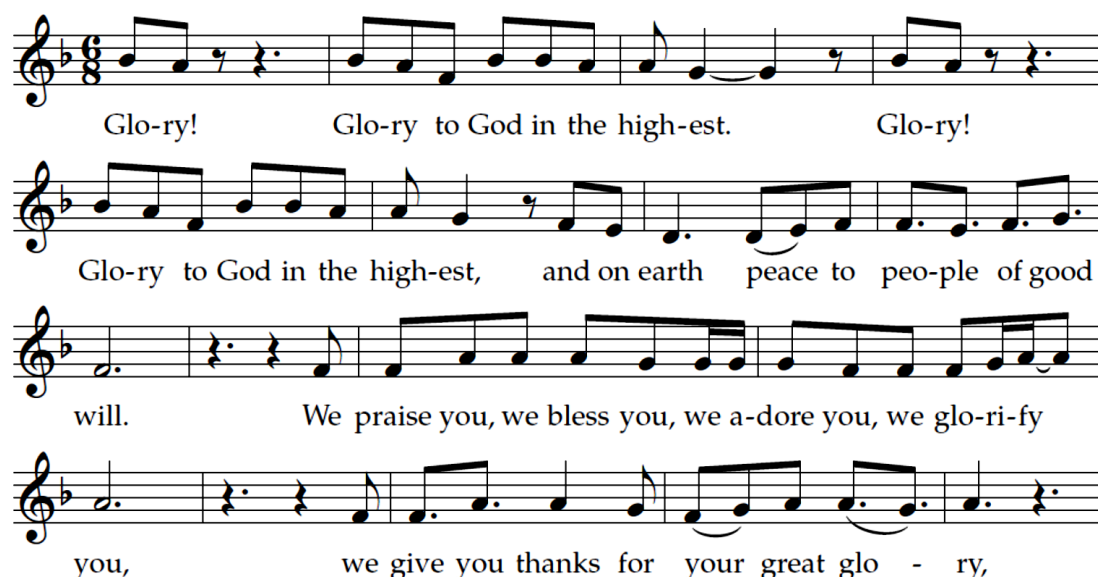
***Lift high the cross, the love of Christ proclaim

## Gospel

**Mt 16:21-27**

Then Peter took Jesus aside and began to rebuke him,  
"God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you."
